Pom-Pom Scarf



Shopping List:

- $\frac{3}{8}$ yard of 60" fabric, such as silk or light weight wool
- $\frac{3}{4}$ yard of $\frac{1}{4}$ " wide trim
- All-purpose thread to coordinate with fabric and trim
- Fabric marking pencil
- SINGER regular point needle
(Size 11 for silk, Size 14 for wool)

Sewing Directions:

1. Press fabric. Cut to measure 8" wide by 60" long (or adjust measurement as desired).
2. Press the side seams under $\frac{3}{8}$ ".
3. Roll the side seams under again $\frac{3}{8}$ ". Secure in place with pins.
4. Stitch side seams along the rolled edge, removing pins as you sew. Press when stitching is completed.
5. To hem the scarf ends, first turn under one scarf end $\frac{1}{2}$ " and press. Turn it under $\frac{1}{2}$ " again and press. Pin the hem in place and stitch. Repeat this process for the opposite end of the scarf.
6. Cut 2 pieces of trim, each measuring 1" longer than the width of the scarf. Pin one trim piece onto one end of the scarf, turning under the trim's short ends by $\frac{1}{2}$ " (to enclose the raw edges of the trim). Take the 2nd trim and repeat this process on the other scarf end.
7. Stitch the trims in place.

Note: Depending on the style of trim being sewn, it might be easier to change from the standard presser foot to the zipper foot, so that it will be easier to stitch along the trim's long edge.
